3rd Sunday of Advent: Year B, Cycle II (Gaudete Sunday)

17th December 2023

Rejoice always! Again, I say, always rejoice!

Some of us have so much pain in our hearts. There's so much of imbedded grief, cares, and worries. The prevailing coronavirus pandemic and its boomerang effects has killed our loved ones, crippled jobs, brought poverty and plunged many into debts. Daily, our pain and difficulties seem to be on the rise rather than decline. There seems to be ever coming sadness and misery than moments of joy or occasions for merry making. The raging wars in Ukraine and the Middle East leaves agony in its trail. Life is frozen to misery. Yet today, our Lord calls us amidst all these to Rejoice, to be happy, to look beyond the horizon of suffering to the rising sun, Christ the Lord, who is about to come into the world. All is not gloomy. There is still much to be happy about: our lives, our health, the opportunity to see and greet one another, etc.

Today, the third Sunday of Advent is referred to as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word meaning rejoice. Today's entrance antiphon drawn from Philippians 4:4-5: echoes this strongly when it says: "Rejoice in the Lord always: again, I say, rejoice! The Lord is near." Having come thus far in our Advent journey, the Church says to us as the prophet Nehemiah said to the Israelites: "Go and enjoy...Do not grieve, for the joy of the LORD is your strength" (Neh. 8, 10). With Christmas in sight, we are exhorted to remain hopeful in joy for the Lord's coming will not be long; for the Lord's coming is certain.

Last week, St. Mark introduced the ministry of John the Baptist who came to alert all humanity to prepare a way for the coming of Christ. Today, however, we read the gospel of John who takes on the same theme as of last week — the person and ministry of John the Baptist (John 1:6-8, 19-28), only that this time, typical of the dialectics between light and darkness, John portrays the personality and witness of John the Baptist as one who "was sent by God...as a witness to speak for the light." His voice rang out from the wilderness and was a force of attraction to all Judea and the whole people of Jerusalem who crowded around him. The surge of this crowd to John the Baptist did not go unnoticed by the Scribes and Pharisees who sent emissaries to ask him several questions, primarily, "who are you?"

To underscore the importance of this identity-question

- "who are you?" – Jesus took it on. His response came when he appeared in the synagogue early in his ministry. His answer is extracted from our 1st reading of today from the prophet Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11. "The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me to..." This is a song of joy and satisfaction of an empowered person. He recounts what God has done in his life, and concluded the passage by making a startling claim: "This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen" (Luke 4:18-19). He is the Messiah who comes to bring good news, proclaim liberty, and announce God's favour upon us – and that's why we rejoice.

Our second reading is an explicit exaltation from St. Paul to us especially on this great and joy-filled Sunday of Advent: "Be happy at all times, pray constantly, and for all things give thanks to God..." In this brief exaltation, we find a wonderful progression. First, it is an exaltation to be happy, joyful and cheerful because our journey so far has been so good. Second, it is an exaltation to "Pray constantly," to be vigilant. Therefore, for Gaudate Sunday to be truly meaningful, it must provoke a great feeling of joy and thankfulness, while still strongly preserving, and keeping us focused on our journey and duty this glorious season of Advent.

Once again, today our gospel revolves round the prophecy and clarion call of the "Prophet of Prophets," John the Baptist. The major difference between today's gospel and that of last week rests simply on the fact that they are accounts from different writers Mark and John. The message remains functionally and ontologically the same. It is still from: "The voice that cries in the wilderness, make a straight way for the Lord."

Why is this reading and call being repeated this joyful Sunday? It is for the purpose of emphasis. It is to remind us that, though we are given a little time to relax and rejoice today, the clarion call is still there: "Make a straight way for the Lord." In order words, our preparation continues. So, it is a way of keeping us alert so that we do not lose focus of where we are going to: "It is NOT Christmas yet!" The joy of this Sunday foreshadows the fullness of joy that Christmas brings.

Rejoice always! Again, I say rejoice!
