1st Sunday of Lent: Year B, Cycle II

18th February 2024

Lead us not into Temptation but deliver us from all Evil!Genesis 9:8-151 Peter 3:18-22Mark 1:12-15

Today is the first Sunday of Lent, a season of Renewal. The season of Lent provides us a great opportunity to shed off our "spiritually tired and weak skin." This is in order to put on a more durable one for our journey. Therefore, on this first Sunday of Lent, the church invites us to renew our commitment with God.

Our first reading recounts the unconditional covenant between God and Noah who represents humanity. This is a covenant of renewal, recreation, and restoration. This covenant was sealed with a rainbow as a sign of God's faithfulness.

In the second reading, Peter reminds us of God's New Covenant with us through Christ. He paid the great price in order to restore us to God. In other words, Christ renewed and strengthened the covenant with his own blood. He did this by opening the spring of baptism through which we were purified and restored to God.

Our gospel from Mark narrates the temptation of Jesus, and the sacrifice he made in order to prepare himself for his mission and journey. From today's text we can deduce that one passion ruled Jesus' life: proclaiming and establishing God's reign of justice, peace, and love on earth. His goal was not to rescue individuals from the earth and transfer them to heaven in order to save their souls. It was all about challenging people to accept God's kingdom as it is manifested on earth. But how was he going to fulfil this mission that the Father had given him? He had no roadmap or action plan to direct him. He possessed the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit that descended on him during his baptism. It was this same Spirit that, in the words of today's gospel, 'drove Jesus out into the wilderness' (Mk. 1:12,) where he was tempted by Satan and guide him on how he is going to establish God's Reign in the world.

Jesus' forty days in the wilderness was a decisive and defining experience for him, determining the path his messianic mission would take. It led him to reject the way of violent revolution adopted by the Zealots, and the way of easy compromise adopted by the Jerusalem elite – the Sadducees and High Priests – and to choose instead the path of redemptive (vicarious) suffering. The way of Jesus would be to turn the other cheek, to walk the second mile, and to take up the cross. He would defeat evil by letting evil do its worst to him, by suffering it in love and forgiving his enemies.

The message Jesus formulated in the wilderness and that we are called to take to heart in these days of Lent, is in the final words of today's gospel: 'Repent and believe the Good News' (Mk. 1:15). This means turning away from the clutter in our lives and to listen to the One who speaks to us in nature, in people, and in the depths of our hearts. Lent is not a dreary, sad season to be patiently endured. It is a joyful season, as today's Lenten preface reminds us: 'Each year you give us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed.'

Lent, then, is a truly graced time; a time to embrace with enthusiasm 'an offer we cannot refuse,' a time to experience afresh the breath of the Spirit and the embrace of God's love; and to grow in our understanding of the riches hidden in Christ. It is not a time for 'beating up' on ourselves and our failures; it is rather a time to focus on God's graciousness and fidelity to his promises as the first reading reminds us - a time to imitate the example of Christ and lay claim to his victory over Satan, as our second reading reminds us. Lent is the springtime of the Spirit, a time of hope and renewal. As we prepare to renew our covenant with God, just like Christ, we must persist in prayer, fast and abstinence. We must ask God to grant us the strength to endure till the end of our own test as Christ did. Also, we must ask the Holy Spirit guide us by granting us humility, courage, and patience this season.
