2nd Sunday of Easter: Year B, Cycle II Divine Mercy Sunday

7th April 2024

'Mercy as our Light'

Today is both the Second Sunday of Easter and the feast of Divine Mercy. This Sunday is at times also called "Doubting Thomas Sunday" because, traditionally the Gospel text read on this day recounts the encounter between Jesus and Thomas, the one who doubted his resurrection. Another interesting name for this Sunday, which is the octave day of Easter, is Low Sunday, a name which originated in the England and Ireland in the Middle Ages to differentiate this Easter octave day from Easter Sunday itself, which was called Hight Sunday.

Today's meditation invites us to Come to the Boundless Mercy of God! God's mercy has always been with mankind, yet how little did mankind know and appreciate God's mercy, reason why the Lord himself deigned to set aside this day as the Feast of Mercy! This he did through the saintly Polish Nun, St. Faustina. The institution of this feast by Jesus himself is a final wakeup call to a world that is indifferent to the great acts of God's mercy. In His infinite goodness God created the world with the human being at the helm of his creation; in pride and arrogance humanity rejected God through our first parents, Adam and Eve; yet, God in his infinite love and unfathomable mercy reached out to mankind with the offer of salvation, which in the fullness of time, he has made manifest in an unspeakable manner in His Only Begotten Son, incarnate, who suffered, died and was buried, and now risen from the dead, redeeming the world. In Jesus Christ, we see the "Face of God's Mercy" - He is God's Misericordiae Vultus!

In the Divine Mercy Diary, no. 341 is recounted an encounter between Jesus and St. Faustina on November 5, 1934. Sister Faustina said to Jesus, "I am very surprised that You bid me to talk about this Feast of Mercy, for they tell me that there is already such a feast..." But Jesus insists: "And who knows anything about this feast? No one! Even those who should be proclaiming My mercy and teaching people about it often do not know about it themselves. That is why I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it." These are the words of Jesus demanding the establishment of the Feast of Mercy.

Pope Saint John Paul II, on April 30, 2000, officially designated the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday and inserted it in the General Roman Calendar. It was on this same day that he canonized the servant of God's Mercy, Sr. Faustina. John Paull II was a "Pope of Mercy" par excellence. How providential that it was on

this same Feast – April 27 - Divine Mercy Sunday 2014 he was canonized!

Today's Gospel text concretely shows us something of the unsearchable depths of God's mercy. We see there the unconditional offer of peace to his fearful disciples; the unconditional forgiveness of their failures and doubts (during his Passion) as he now appears to them after his resurrection so as to strengthen their faith; the unconditional offer of mercy and the gift of faith to the doubting Thomas; and above all, the institution of the Sacrament of Mercy - Confession - in the words: "Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained." (Cf. Jn 20:19-23, 24-31). There is hardly any offer of Mercy so concrete and real as the underserving forgiveness which God gives us in Jesus Christ. Yet how indifferent, at times even hostile, do we tend to be toward such a great gift; like when we disregard the celebration of the sacrament of Confession or question its celebration at the hands of the priest, minister of God's mercy, who himself, unworthy as he is, lives and ministers only because of God's mercy.

Dear friends, it doesn't matter what baggage of recurrent sins we carry; it doesn't matter how long we have strayed from God; it doesn't matter how shameful we think what we have done/said or failed to do is; it doesn't even matter how many times we directly insulted and rejected God; all what Jesus is asking is that you open up your heart to the fountain of mercy which he is pouring out today upon the whole world. Veneration of the Divine Mercy image; taking the Divine Mercy Novena (especially prior to this great feast); Praying the 3 O'clock Prayer; reciting the Divine Mercy chaplet; preaching the Mercy of God to others; being merciful to others; and participating in the Sacraments of Mercy (especially the Eucharist and Confession) are all channels of tapping into the unfathomable mercy of God. On this feast day, the following practices have attached to them a plenary indulgence, that is, complete forgiveness of sins and all punishment due to sin: - Go to Confession; - Receive Holy Communion; - Adore Jesus is the Blessed Sacrament and recite the Creed and the 'Our Father'; - Invoke Jesus through the prayer: "Jesus, I trust in you"; - Venerate the Holy Image of the Divine Mercy; - Have the intention of receiving God's mercy.
