Christ in the Storms of our Lives

Job 38:1,8-11 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 Mark 4:35-41

Most often, we are caught in-between situations that seem to leave us with no other choices than to do what we have to do for the sake of a seemingly greater good such as defending ourselves, gaining a good name for ourselves, keeping our reputations, keeping our consciences free, proving that we are on the right, etc. These are the normal human tendencies that urge us on to retaliate or compensate for the lack or mishaps in our lives. Today's gospel narrates to us the miracle of the calming of the storm. Jesus was in the boat sleeping with his head on a cushion. The wind was right overhead, and the boat was almost sinking. The apostles, and those on board, battled out by themselves in vain until they remembered that Jesus was in the stern. So, they woke him up saying: "Master, do you not care? We are lost!"

In today's first reading, Job, a tormented man, demands justice from God amidst the multi-trials he is undergoing. Job has been infested with suffering although he was innocent and in his anguish he calls on God to justify this suffering.

In our second reading, St. Paul equates his entire life to a storm with these storms signifying the various difficulties he is undergoing in his life. In today's excerpt, St. Paul reminds everyone that through all the storms of life, it is the love of Christ that counts.

The storm in today's gospel foreshadows the future trials which the disciples and the Church were to experience. Jesus is there in the boat as in the Church and the disciples are also in the same boat [Church]. This boat [Church] is battled on all sides by wild winds of persecution and intimidation, and there is the fear of failure and death but Jesus does nothing to intervene. Rather, he is right there waiting to change situations if he is acknowledged as Lord and Master. In the midst

of their fright, they turned to Jesus and woke him up saying: "Do you not care? We are going down." This is prayer and what every disciple needs to do in the heart of difficulties. Prayer is the only means to wake Jesus, not crying and trying to stabilize things by our own might. Mark's description of a sleeping Jesus is not just a saying about someone who is resting. Jesus was not just resting but was waiting to be brought into action. This drama of today's happenings at sea has a symbolic sense. As God, Jesus knew the boat was being rocked and he wanted to see the degree of faith that will be exercised by his disciples before he intervenes. When he finally rebukes the storm, the people realize that he was truly God. For he himself has said that the gates of hell will never prevail. Jesus answers their prayer and tells them to improve on their faith: "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" (Mk. 4:40).

Today's readings focus on the various trials we face daily and the assurance that God never abandons us to perdition even when we feel his seeming absence. Amongst all that which makes mankind dreadful, the readings look at the sea as the most terrifying creation of God whose bizarre and awesome nature signifies the various trials and tribulations we face daily. The action of the sailors to overcome their fears and sail through with the help of God signifies the endurance Christ expects of us in the course of all the trials we undergo. To end, the readings also want to point out to us that in the midst of our storms even if God is not acting immediately, he is always with us as is exemplified in Jesus' presence with his disciples in the boat in the posture of a sleeper.

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years.
