Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul, Apostles

God calls us from our brokenness that he might transform us for his mission

Today, we celebrate the feast day of two very prominent figures and pillars of the Church: Ss. Peter and Paul, Apostles (transferred from Yesterday 29th June). They were both great sinners, yet God did not curse nor abandon them. He rather called them from their sinfulness and transformed them for his mission. St. Peter was a fisherman called while fishing and he left his boat to follow Christ in a journey during which he was transformed to be a fisher of men. In Lk. 5:8, after acknowledging his sinfulness, Peter requested Christ to depart from him since he is a sinner. This weakness was further aggravated at the trial when Peter refused Jesus three times just because he never wanted to be associated with the passion of Christ or to suffer Martyrdom like him. Similarly, St. Paul, as Saul, was a persecutor of the faith and Christ called him on his journey to Damascus to persecute the Christians (Cfr. Acts. 9:1-19). The Lord appeared to him, and he fell from his horse and was blinded. He will rise transformed.

The first reading recalls Peter's miraculous release from prison where he had been held by King Herod. In the second reading, Paul, as if summarizing his entire apostolic and missionary activity, says: "I was rescued from the lion's mouth" (2 Tim. 4:17). Both testimonies show, in a certain sense, the common journey traveled by the two Apostles. Both were sent by Christ to proclaim the Gospel in an environment hostile to the work of salvation. Peter had already experienced this resistance in Jerusalem, where Herod, to win the favor of the Jews, had thrown him into prison, intending "to bring him out to the people" (Acts 12:4). But he was miraculously saved from Herod's hands, and thus he could complete his evangelizing mission, first in Jerusalem and later in Rome, putting all his energy into the service of the newborn Church.

Paul too, sent by the risen Christ to many pagan cities and peoples in the Roman Empire, encountered strong resistance from his compatriots and from the civil authorities. His letters are a splendid testimony to these difficulties and to the great struggle he had to endure for the Gospel cause. At the end of his mission, he could write as we have heard in our second reading today: "My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith..." (2 Tim. 4:6-7).

"Who do you say I am?" This was Jesus' question directly to his apostles in today's gospel text. He intended them to tell him their own understanding of who he is, especially as they have witnessed him in the everyday unfolding of events: the miracles, the parables, etc. Ss. Peter and Paul, each with his own personal and ecclesial experience, understood Christ as the Son of God. We too, like these two great apostles, have a lot to learn especially as regards our own lives of witnessing. Christ came to call sinners not the righteous. When he called sinners, he transformed them making them into great witnesses: Zacchause, the tax collected paid back all those he has cheated upon; Matthew left his cash table and followed the Lord; the possessed were cleansed and they followed the Lord; the woman caught in adultery became a fervent disciple of the Lord, etc. When Jesus asked his disciples: "Who do you say I am?" he expected them to tell him something about what they have experienced and understood about him. They could not say who he was if they had not experienced him in a very personal way. Christ too calls each one of us from the different qualities of our life's backgrounds and wants us to come and be with him that we may experience him and then be able to say who he is. "Who do you say I am?" If we have not experienced Christ, how can we say who he is? God calls each one of us and then transform us that we might bear witness to him as was the two apostles, Peter and Paul. No matter how sinful we may be, so long as we are able to acknowledge our sinfulness and make, then we can become saints.

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available: Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.
- Training must be refreshed every 2 years.
