Sunday 16 June 2024 : Eleventh Sunday of the Year

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus offers us two parables of the Kingdom: the parable of the seed in the field and the parable of the mustard seed. We can perhaps imagine the child Jesus watching with curiosity as a farmer sowed his fields, returning regularly to see how the crop was growing, and being impressed at the result at harvest time. Perhaps the parable grew inside Jesus, as his human mind worked out how to describe to his fellow humans what his divine mind knew about the Kingdom of God. We may not know the result of our work and prayer in this life, or if we do live to see it, we don't necessarily understand how it is that our work and prayer has contributed. In this way, we are like the farmer, for whom the Kingdom of God grows day and night as he wakes or sleeps, he knows not how. Let us pray that we, like the farmer, may recognise the Lord's time of harvest, the time for action. Even if our faith feels as small as a mustard seed, there is every reason to expect a great outcome!
