Called and Sent on Mission

Two of today's readings focus on the ideas of vocation and mission. Amos is compelled to defend his calling as a prophet to Israel in the first reading. The summons and initial ministry of the twelve carefully selected disciples of Jesus are described in the Gospel of Mark. These readings serve as a reminder that those who are sent to share the Word of God with others must rely on the authority of the one sending them, not on their own resources.

The earliest of the major prophets, Amos, lived in the ninth century before to the birth of Christ. The northern kingdom of Israel was experiencing wealth and peace at this period. It was also a period of widespread corruption and impoverished people's exploitation. Amos spoke out bravely against the injustices done to the underprivileged. Amaziah, a prominent member of the priestly order, became enraged with his sermons. Amaziah was a lackey of King Jeroboam II and resided in the affluent Royal Sanctuary of Bethel. It was not in his best advantage for Amos to raise concerns about the unfair actions of the political establishment. Thus, he gives Amos instructions to return to Judah, his birthplace, and prophesy there. In response Amos defends his prophetic vocation as a direct call from the Lord, not an inherited position with status, like that of Amaziah and the priestly caste to which he belonged.

The gospel reading from Mark for today picks up where the previous Sunday's left off. Jesus calls twelve of his followers and sends them on a journey across the cities and villages where he had already preached after being rejected in his hometown of Nazareth. He gives them the same mission and authority that he got from his Father-the power to heal, call for repentance, and drive out bad spirits. Jesus gives them specific instructions on how they are to live, rather than what sermons they are to teach. They are to travel in pairs rather than individually. This is in contrast to the individualistic style of the maverick preachers, self-appointed prophets and bogus healers who were familiar figures in the first century AD. They are not to take anything for the journey except a staff: 'no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses'; not even 'a spare tunic' (Mk 6:9). In other words, their lifestyle is to be marked by a radical dependence on God and on the generosity of the people to whom they minister. Finally, the place of their ministry is to be people's homes rather than the synagogues.

At first glance, the first apostolic mission described in Mark may not seem to have much to do with the complicated issues the Church is currently confronting in the twenty-first century. However, it pinpoints the central mission of the Church. The Church is called to be a community of missionaries, carrying on Jesus Christ's mission in support of God's reign, just as the apostles who serve as its cornerstone. Its authority and power reside not in itself, but in the word of the one who calls and sends it. It is challenged to travel light, putting its trust in divine providence rather than in material resources, and being open to receive as well as to give. It is required to confront the forces of evil and serve as the agent of God's healing power in a sick and broken world. Above all, it is challenged to witness to God's power by a radical simplicity of lifestyle.

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years.
