The Lord will Redeem, Reunify and Restore Us

Jer 23:1-6

Eph 2:13-18

Mk 6:30-34

Today's readings are centred on the theme of redemption, reunification, and restoration of God's people. Hence, the church invites us to celebrate Christ, the true king and compassionate shepherd who redeems and restores his people to the Father.

The first reading is a prophecy concerning the arrival of Christ, the Messiah. A dispersed population is an indication that something is wrong. It is an indication of weak leadership and a broken system. Thus, like sheep in the absence of a shepherd, the impoverished masses must disperse in order to survive. This is the picture that permeates modern society worldwide. Therefore, this first reading is extremely critical leaders—priests, pastors, of directors, governors, presidents, and anyone else in a position of authority—who, through carelessness or apathy, have permitted their people to suffer or go wrong. "I will take care of you for your deeds," declares the Lord. All this implies is that judgement day is near.

Christ is the fulfilment of this prophesy. His selfimmolation has already marked the start of this redemptive mission. Until the end of time, when Jesus ultimately returns all to His Father, Jesus will carry on with it. Then, once he has destroyed every dominion, authority, and power, the end will arrive when he gives the kingdom to God the Father (1 Cor 15: 24).

In the second reading, Paul reminds us that: "...You that used to be so far apart have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ." This simply means that Christ is the fulfilment of the messianic prophecy. He is our peace and has broken down the barrier, which is used to keep us apart. Through his sacrifice, he has reunified us with God.

In the gospel, Christ also demonstrated that he is that promised Davidic king and good shepherd. He will not rest until our souls, and our land is completely healed and restored to his Father. As a compassionate and wise king, Jesus knows our situation. He is doing something about it and will not rest until we are redeemed and restored to God. Christ does not keep quiet over our conditions. He sees and knows that negligent shepherds have abandoned us.

Thousands of lives have been lost through dangerous land and sea border crossings. Today's global immigration problem is a sign of leadership and system failure. The human shepherds of our nations have all failed God and all of us. However, the good news is that God will restore us. He will repair the broken elements of our land.

This is a message of hope for all passing through all forms of political, social, and economic crisis. We simply need to obey Christ's teachings and instructions to be redeemed and restored to his Father. Trusting Christ, our king and shepherd, let us always proclaim without ceasing: "The Lord is my shepherd. There is nothing I shall want!".

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years.
