# Year B (Psalter Week 3)

Welcome to St Patrick's Church. Today's readings make it clear that God chose us. Before the world was made, God our Father chose us, in Christ, to praise the glory of His grace, His free gift to us in the Beloved. We do not need to overly worry about material things, because the Lord has set us free and given us the richness of His grace. Like the prophet Amos, we may feel unworthy, but we are all called to bring God's message to all people. The Lord will always be near to help us.
