SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

21sr June 2024 AD Year B (Psalter Week 4)

Welcome to St Patrick's Church. Today's readings are centred around the allegory of sheep and shepherd to represent our relationship with God and His relationship with us. In the Gospel, Jesus looks on the people with compassion because they are like sheep without a shepherd. He teaches the Good News that the people, who have been dispersed like lost sheep, will be brought back into the fold. Let us always follow Jesus our Good Shepherd who will lead us through the dark valleys and into the lush pastures for the Kingdom.

First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6—The remnant of my flock I will gather and I will raise up shepherds to look after them

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want (Psalm 22) Responsorial Psalm:

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18—Christ Jesus is the peace between us, and has made the two into one **Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia! The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice, says the Lord:

I know them and they follow me. Alleluia! (John 10:30-34)

Gospel Reading: Mark 6:30-34 — They were like sheep without a shepherd
