Welcome to St Patrick's Church. This morning we are blessed to have Fr Nicholas Williams return to preach for us. Fr Nicholas is from Cardiff but currently on the staff of The Royal English College, Valladolid, Spain. Today's readings speak of how God feeds us— but we "do not live on bread alone". It is only Jesus that can satisfy our hunger for God. The Lord feeds us with the Eucharist, just as in times past he fed the people of Israel with manna from heaven. Through this act of God's love we can learn that the Lord is indeed our God.
