Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We continue to hear from a number of parishioners invited by Fr. James to share a little about their faith, what's important to them and what has helped them grow in their relationship with Jesus.

Steve Leigh writes...

In 1997, when I lived in the Parish of Our Lady of Sorrows Bognor Regis, I went on a pilgrimage to Medjugorje. I had never been on one before and didn't know what to expect, and the passengers started to say the Rosary on the coach to the airport, something I found quite strange to say in public. If I had said it before it would be in private, and only said if we had family and friends in crisis.

Post Medjugorje many lovely spiritual events happened to me when I was home, and I felt inspired to ask the Parish Priest if I could lead the Rosary before Sunday Mass with a few of my friends from the Knights of Saint Columba. This went down extremely well with parishioners. In 2000 I moved with my job to Denmead and joined Sacred Heart parish. I did other things then being on the Finance Committee and serving at Mass, and it was not until 2018 after I had been to a very spiritual retreat to Canada, that I was

inspired again to start and help Alpha, and my love for the Rosary enriched. Again, Fr Jeremy allowed me with help, to say the Rosary before Saturday night Mass here, and then COVID hit, and with Jim Trott we posted videos of saying the Rosary on the Church website.

The best was to come, now 11 weeks in, The New Rosary Group has started here on Tuesday nights at 6.45pm, up to 26 people come along to say the Rosary for everyone in our community (that's for you and your families too) and for evangelisation in our Parish. We also tie in Medjugorje pre our own pilgrimage in October, and say Our lady's intentions for World Peace, She inspires me to get closer to Jesus so much, and I invite everyone to come along and be inspired and say the Rosary. In private it is quiet, in public the inspiration comes from the numbers making the responses to Heaven louder for and from Sacred Heart each week.

From this week's E-News, Bishop Philip writes...

The unrest of the last few days across the towns and cities of our land has been unsettling and we rightly pray for an end to violence and destruction. The anger seems largely focused on asylum seekers and migrants, yet we must always remember that the exiled Holy Family of Nazareth, fleeing into Egypt, is the archetype of every refugee family. Jesus, Mary and Joseph are the models and protectors of every migrant, pilgrim and refugee of whatever kind who is forced to leave their native land to seek another place.

As Catholics, it is our task to care for refugees and migrants and to welcome the stranger, seeing Christ in every brother and sister in need, especially those who flee persecution, armed conflicts, natural disasters, or chronic economic conditions. The human dignity and the rights of asylum seekers must always be respected, regardless of their citizenship, visa status or mode of arrival. On the other hand, of course, all nations have a right to regulate migration across their borders and to have borders to protect their citizens. Asylum and the care of refugees is thus a major challenge for our times and a complex moral, economic and practical dilemma for the countries of Europe and for the US.

Let us pray for our leaders and administrators that they may find the wisest and best ways forward and be filled with loving compassion when making judgments and decisions.


