25th August 2024

Lord, to Whom shall we go?

For the 21st Sunday of OT, Year B

When faced with a life-crossing decision, we frequently don't know which path to take. These are the times when we have to make the proper choices, and the decisions we make then have an impact on our future. These choices could relate to our marriage partners, careers, or academic endeavours, among other things. I faced this decision at one point in my own life, having to decide whether to accept God's call or reject it. I'm grateful that the Holy Spirit provided me with the insight I needed to make the best decision.

In today's first reading, having almost come to the end of his mission, Joshua reminded Israel of how faithful and pleasing the Lord has been to them. Finally, he challenged them: "If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve..." Their response was relatively rapid and positive: "We have no intention of deserting the Lord our God..."

In our second reading, Paul employs the analogy of marriage to explain and remind us of Christ's relationship with His disciples. Paul describes this relationship as a mystery with many implications. It is a relationship based on a mutual love for one another.

In today's gospel, after the bread of life discourse, some followers of Christ were disappointed. What they heard was not what they expected to hear from Christ. This teaching is too difficult for us! You are complicating our lives! They could not take it anymore. For this reason, many of them chose to abandoned Him. So, turning to his disciples, Christ asked: "What about you, do you want to go away too?" This question from Christ is like Joshua's. It leaves one with an option to remain with or to abandon Christ at challenging moments in life. It is like saying, if you too are not convinced and comfortable with this truth, you may also leave.

There are lots of lessons for us today. Many of us come to Christ thinking that everything must be easy. Some of us come with fixed expectations and just to hear what we wish to hear. So, if our expectations are not met, we quit and bid Christ farewell. So, we must ask ourselves today. Does my faith depend on God meeting my expectations?

For the 22nd Sunday of OT, Year B

Today, the twenty second Sunday of ordinary time, we rejoice in the Law of God which is fulfilled in the Sacrament of love and dwells in a pure and transformed heart. Hence, today's readings lead us to reflect on the best way to obey it for the sake of our own salvation.

In our first reading, Moses reminded his people of the commandment of God and urged them to be steadfast to it in order to be successful in life. Importantly, he warned them not to add or remove from it. However, this warning was not taken seriously, because the Pharisees multiplied the ten commandments to about six hundred and thirteen legal codes.

So, in today's gospel, Jesus confronted the Pharisees because of their hypocrisy. They never observed the law that they multiplied for their people. This is a dangerous way of life that we must be careful of. We must not live a hypocritical life, or even make life difficult for others.

Furthermore, by saying that: "What comes out of a man is what defiles him," Christ calls us to self-evaluation. The malicious intentions, the hatred, pride, the corrupt tendencies we harbor in our heart are really what define and make us who we are. They are the vices that make us bad. We must evict them before they rock our spiritual boat. They are the real and hidden enemies that we must fight and defeat daily.

The best way to be faithful to God's command is to allow our hearts to be transformed by it. So, rather than pay excessive attention to the letters of the law and physical purity, we must heed Paul's advice: "Let your hearts be inwardly transformed, so that you will know the will of God." (Rom. 12: 2). God's will is his law. It must motivate us to love others, and to avoid evil. It must evoke true repentance and a sincere will to forgive others. It must keep us firm in faith. Above all, it must move us to pursue only what is good, just, noble and holy.

Today, the apostle James admonishes us in our second reading: Accept and submit to the word [God's command] which has been planted in you...you must do what the word tells you." Of course, the best way to do this is to let our Christianity find expressions in the way we live, love and treat one another.

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years.

Attendees will receive certificates on completion of their training to support continuing ministry.
