Let me start by giving a confession. As a cradle to grave Catholic, I believe I am typical, well maybe, but until recently I have never picked up the Bible to read. Why would I, every weekend I am given the snippets that the church knows are important that I hear in the readings. So, what was My road to Denmead (easier to get to than Damascus) moment.
