

# **EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

## 4th August 2024 AD

## Year B (Psalter Week 2)

Welcome to St Patrick's Church. Our readings this week remind us that Jesus is the "Bread of Life". This phrase does not mean 'bread' but Jesus Himself. It is only Jesus who can satisfy the hunger we have for God. He feeds this hunger in the Eucharist and in Scripture (we do not live on Bread alone but from every Word that comes from the mouth of God cf. Matt 4:4). In times past God fed the people of Israel with manna from heaven and the Law of Moses. Now we are fed with Jesus the "Bread of Life" and Jesus the "Word of God". From this act of the Father's love we can learn that the Lord is indeed our God.

First Reading:	Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15—I will rain down bread for you from heaven
Responsorial Psalm:	The Lord gave them bread from heaven. (Psalm 77)
Second Reading:	Ephesians 4:17, 20-24—Put on a new self that has been created in God's way
Gospel Acclamation:	Alleluia, alleluia! I am the Way, the Truth and the Life says the Lord; no one can come to the Father except through me. Alleluia! (John 14:5)
Gospel Reading:	John 6:24-35 —He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst
Communion Antiphon:	You have given us, O Lord, bread from heaven, endowed with all delights and sweetness in every taste. (Wisdom 16:20)
