Year B (Psalter Week 1)

Welcome to St Patrick's Church. The Church is a collection of human beings who, in communion with one another, form the Body of Christ here on earth. Jesus lives within His Church and in loving one another we love Him. Sometimes the teachings of Jesus can appear to be challenging, especially to the secular world, but we—the Body of Christ—know that He has the message of eternal life and there is no one else to whom we wish to go. We show our love for Christ in our service of His Church, reaching out Jesus' hands to bless His creations.

I should like to thank you all for your prayers for Liam when he was taken ill back in the middle of May, it seems a long time ago now and between QA and Petersfield he was in hospital for 10 weeks, but thankfully he is still with us. I am convinced the prayers saved him, the first weekend he was in QA I don't think the medical staff held out much hope, but God knew better. Life is a little different but it is lovely to have him home, and he remains cheerful. He gets stronger every day and is having physio at home from the Community physio team. He had very good care throughout his stay in hospital, and the visits from the QA chaplaincy team of Fr Andrew from Cosham, Deacon Kim from Bordon and Fr James were much appreciated as were the visits from Fr Mark, not that Liam remembers anything of the first 2 weeks when he was so ill. When he was transferred to Petersfield Fr Peter Hollins, from St Laurence's Church visited him also and gave him Communion, so he was very well cared for.
