Sowers of Peace

Wis. 2: 12.17-20;

Ps. 53; James 3: 16-4, 3;

Mk. 9: 30-37

The church extends an invitation to us on this twenty-fifth Sunday, to pay attention to Christ and emulate him by leading a calm and orderly life.

The first reading for today refers to Christ, the Son of God, who was crucified by his enemies. Jesus was a holy man who chastised and denounced the conceited Pharisees and scribes of his day. They were offended, so they persecuted and crucified Christ. This passage is also fulfilled in the lives of all those who are persecuted unfairly in the modern world for having moral convictions. Like Christ, we occasionally face persecution for our justice from both our friends and foes. But we must not waver, for God will undoubtedly justify us, just as he justified Christ.

Our second reading reminds us of the importance of focusing sincerely on the things that unite us rather than on the ones that divide us. While many homes, families, and communities experience regular strife and chaos, everyone naturally wants to live in harmony. Even though disagreements will inevitably arise in life, we must resist letting them split us apart. Sadly, egotistical goals are usually at the center of these conflicts. James warns us against letting egotistical goals ruin our bonds with one another, our families, and our communities.

In today's gospel, Jesus predicts his impending suffering, death, and resurrection. Regretfully, rather of considering what Christ was saying, his disciples secretly argued about who was the greatest. Naturally, the earthly government they believed Christ had come to build was the target of their argument. Like the group of

people James addressed, the followers of Jesus were dealing with a conflict of interest.

This tendency to prioritize one's own goals over those of others is something we frequently observe in families, churches, and society at large. There, we witness animosity, rumours, hostility, violence, indifference, and threats to people's lives and property, among other vices. Peaceful cohabitation and the common good are compromised by all of these. Peace, wealth, and progress are impossible wherever they exist.

Therefore, by using a child as an example for us today, Jesus only teaches us that we must become like children to be great. Of course, this does not mean being childish. Instead, it means being child-like. It means that we must live our lives in humble service to God and one another.

Finally, to be great is to be focused on something other than oneself. It means we can accommodate, welcome, and work in harmony with others, just as children always do. It also means the readiness to accept the truth and to reflect positively on it.

Prayers for life - stop assisted suicide

The Prime Minister is paving the way for a parliamentary vote before Christmas to legalise assisted suicide. The Government and assisted suicide lobbyists are putting intense pressure on MPs to support a Private Members' Bill to rush legislation into law. Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years.
