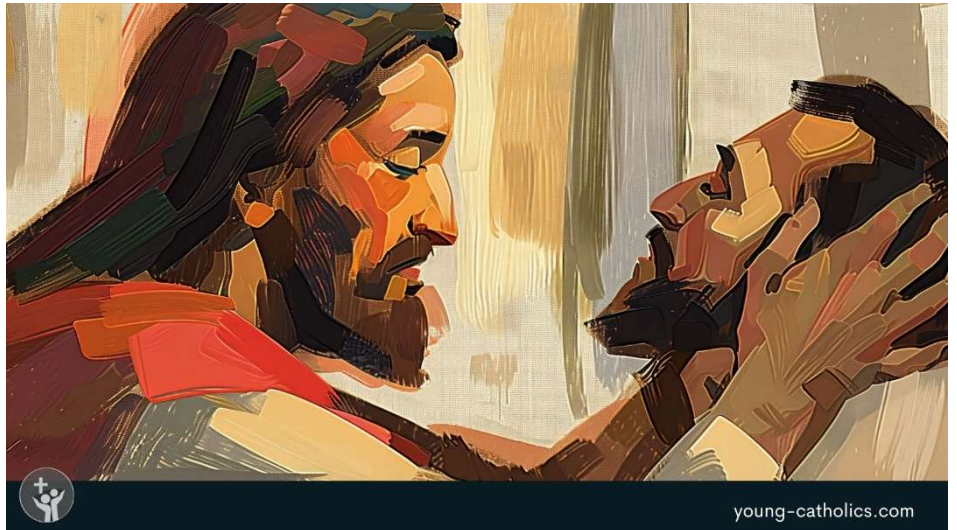

## Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Jesus Heals the Deaf Man

In the Gospel reading from Mark, Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech issue. Despite Jesus' instructions to keep the miracle quiet, the news spreads widely. This story shows Jesus' compassion and power to heal. We all suffer from spiritual deafness at times. Sometimes we don't want to hear God's voice or the opinions of others. Jesus can heal us, just as He healed the deaf man, if we take time to listen.



To overcome our spiritual deafness, we need to spend more time in prayer. Listening to God, rather than just speaking, can open our hearts to His healing. Jesus will heal us if we humbly ask Him to do so.

The 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B readings remind us of God's healing power, His justice, and our call to live out our faith. We are encouraged to trust in God's promises, treat everyone with equality, and seek healing from Jesus. Let us take these lessons to heart and apply them in our daily lives.

### Prayer

Lord, open our ears to hear Your voice and our hearts to receive Your healing. Help us to treat everyone with the love and respect they deserve. Guide us to live out our faith in all that we do. Amen.

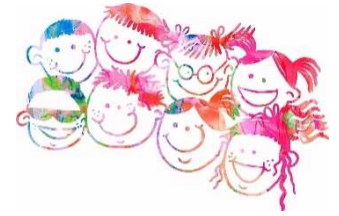

## News from St Peter's School

*Headteacher Richard Cunningham writes...* The new school year got off to a collective start at St Peter's this week with pupils from Years 1 to 6 joining together on the first morning back for worship. Even with primary-aged children, the challenges of this summer across the country could not be ignored, likewise the tragic loss of 3 girls in Southport of primary school age. Therefore, the Beatitudes were chosen as the scripture for our worship, and rather than dwelling on the loss and violence, the focus was on inclusion, love, understanding and community, from the classroom to the playground to the wider community. Our worship was concluded with the following prayer:

*Merciful God, author and giver of peace, as we continue to pray for the families and friends of those who died and those who were injured in Southport, we remember that You have created each of us in your image, and that everyone is worthy of dignity and respect. Heavenly Father, listen to the cry that rises from many towns in our country, from those subjected to violence and racial hatred. We pray for peace which, as your son Jesus Christ told us, is a peace which the world cannot give. We pray that closed eyes may be opened to see beyond the boundaries of race, religion, and hatred. May hearts be renewed to embrace all your children as brothers and sisters. In your righteousness, stir the hearts of your people that, rejoicing in our diversity, we may be assured of your love, be free of all fear and strive for peace. Amen.*

Please keep the pupils, staff, families and community of St Peter's Catholic Primary School in your prayers for the academic year ahead.

## **Annual Mass Count**

The annual Mass count is coming. Over four weekends, beginning with **Sunday 22 September**, parishes across all the dioceses of England and Wales will be undertaking their annual Mass count, that is, the numbers of people in attendance in church at Sunday Mass. Until 2018, the count was taken over the four weeks of October, but experts argue that a better picture of the situation can be gained from taking instead the last two weekends of September and the first two weekends of October. This is because, as many parish priests point out, the school half-term holidays disrupt the usual statistics, with many families away, and others visiting. The numbers for 2024 for our Diocese will be interesting. In many of our parishes, numbers have not returned to what they were before the COVID pandemic. Yet there are also new faces around, with younger families especially. This suggests that the current situation is fluid. Numbers are not everything, of course, but the statistical data given this year will be very useful to pastors and parishes in planning ahead and working out where resources need to be focused. Thank you in advance to our fab Sacristans who will be facilitating this important endeavour.

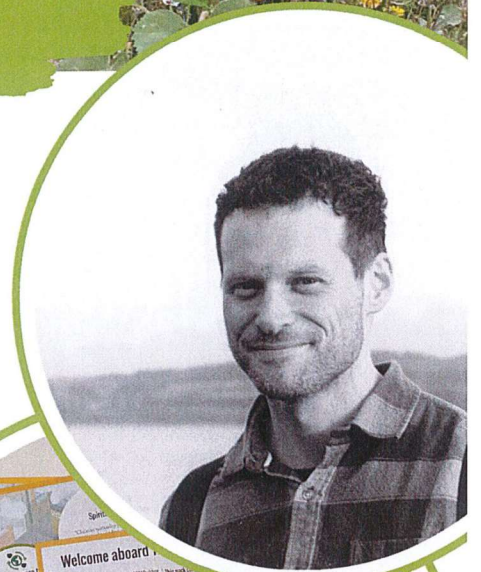
