Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



On the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, the readings invite us to reflect on humility, wisdom, and service. These themes challenge us to examine how we live our faith and interact with others. Let us explore the messages in these readings to deepen our understanding and commitment to following Christ.

The first reading from the Book of Wisdom speaks of the just person suffering because of their righteousness. The wicked plot against the just, trying to see if God will save them. This passage reminds us that living a righteous life may lead to suffering and opposition. We can learn from this reading that true wisdom is not always appreciated. Sometimes, doing the right thing brings challenges and hardships. However, we are called to remain faithful and trust that God sees and knows our struggles. This reflection helps us understand that wisdom from God leads us on a path that may not be easy, but it is the right path. We should seek wisdom that brings peace, righteousness, and a closer relationship with God. Staying true to this wisdom, even when it is hard, is our call as Christians.

The second reading from the Letter of James speaks about the conflicts that arise from selfish desires. James urges us to seek peace and righteousness instead of giving in to jealousy and selfish ambition. He reminds us that true wisdom comes from God and leads to good deeds. Righteous living means putting God's will above our own desires. It involves seeking peace, being gentle, and showing mercy. These actions reflect God's wisdom and bring harmony into our lives and communities. James' message encourages us to examine our motives and actions. Are we driven by selfishness, or are we seeking to live in a way that honours God and serves others? By choosing righteousness and peace, we align our lives with God's will.

In the Gospel Jesus teaches his disciples about true greatness. He tells them that whoever wants to be first must be the servant of all. He then places a child in their midst, showing them that welcoming the least is welcoming Him. This lesson on humility and service is crucial for us. Jesus turns the idea of greatness upside down. Instead of seeking power and status, He calls us to serve others, especially those who are vulnerable and in need. By serving others with humility, we follow Jesus' example. It is not about being noticed or praised, but about genuine care and love for others. This is how we live out our faith and show the world the love of Christ.

The readings call us to a deeper understanding of humility, wisdom, and service. They challenge us to live out our faith in practical ways, showing love and care for others. As we reflect on these messages, let us commit to following Christ's example in our daily lives.

Our Lady of Walsingham



Bishop Philip writes...

Tuesday, 24th September, is the (new) feast day of Our Lady of Walsingham. The story of Walsingham is enchanting. It was in that tiny Norfolk village in the year 1061 that a noble lady called Richeldis had visions of the Blessed Virgin. In prayer, Our Lady showed her the Holy House of Nazareth, the home where Jesus, Mary and Joseph lived. She asked Lady Richeldis to build a replica of the house in the village, which she duly did, and so Walsingham soon became an international pilgrimage centre, after Rome and Jerusalem,

one of the greatest in the mediaeval world. Thousands of pilgrims, from kings to the lowest, flocked there to pray to God, to honour Mary and to seek answers, often miraculous, to their prayers. Although destroyed at the Reformation by King Henry VIII, in 20C the shrine was revived and today flourishes as a place where both Anglicans and Catholics go to pray. Indeed, Walsingham is now England's National Marian Shrine. In the Middle Ages, more than any other land, England was known for its love of the Blessed Virgin: this is why it was called Mary's Dowry, and why so many churches were dedicated to St. Mary. Today it's a very different story with so many souls adrift in danger. We can thus do no better than turn to Mary, asking Her help. God did something new in the eleventh century. Let us ask Him to do something new today. Let us pray through Mary for the evangelisation and conversion of England, for the spread of Christian values and for a reawakening and a re-reception in this land of the Catholic faith. I rejoice that it was on the feast of Our Lady of Walsingham, 24th September 2012, that I was ordained as the Bishop of Portsmouth: please pray for me next Tuesday. [Image: Royal Docks]

All Readers - New Lectionary Translation Coming Soon!

All Catholic Churches in England and Wales are changing to the new translation of the Lectionary – the Book used for all Scripture Readings at Mass.

When, Why and How?

WHEN? The change will take place from the First Sunday of Advent (1st December 2024).

WHY? To make the text more faithful to the original language and easier to proclaim.

HOW? We are arranging sessions for **new and all existing** Readers to see it and try it out. For convenience, the sessions have been arranged spread over different weekday evenings and at weekends in the coming months to allow all Readers to attend. It is necessary for **all Readers at Sunday Mass** to attend before 1 December.

You can purchase the new 'Peoples' Sunday/Weekday Missal from the Catholic Truth Society (CTS) online https://newlectionary.org or by calling CTS directly on 020 7640 0042. The Missals will not be available to buy from the parish shop. However, if anyone who doesn't have access to the internet would like a copy of the Sunday or Weekday Missal please contact Sue in the presbytery office. We have been advised by a parishioner last week that the people's missals will not be available for delivery until April 2025! Fr. James has a couple of suggestions for anyone who would like the new translation sooner:

Universalis

Universalis Publishing was started in 1995 with the aim of harnessing computer technology to help in enriching the spiritual life of Christians, specifically by making the liturgical and devotional resources of the Catholic Church available on the new electronic media.

The Liturgy of the Hours is now available on the web site and as apps, downloads and e-books, and so is the Mass: both the readings at Mass and the unique "Mass Today" page which combines the Order of Mass with the prayers and readings in one continuous stream.

Visitors to the Universalis web site include priests, laity, the young and the old. They come from all denominations: some have not heard of the Breviary before; some cannot afford the books; and some are blind and cannot use them. www.universalies.com

The cost of producing the New Lectionary just for the UK will mean a substantial price increase from the 1st November 2024 so you may wish to take advantage of our current offers.

CAFOD's Family Fast Day appeal - Harvest Friday 4 October

Jo Lewry shares the latest news from CAFOD...



Many thanks to all the parish volunteers and supporters who attended our Harvest fast day meeting on Saturday 7th September. It was great to see you and share with you our fast day story. This Harvest we are sharing Daniel's story. He is from the Democratic Republic of Congo, and he attended a training college supported by CAFOD to learn carpentry skills so that he could support himself and his family.

His story shows the impact of vocational training. Despite his parents' hard work, Daniel's family often went hungry and there

was no money for school. As soon as he could, Daniel took on labouring jobs to support his family. Reflecting on his childhood, Daniel said, "I never want anyone to go through the life I had when I was younger." But thanks to generous donations from previous fast days CAFOD has been able to support young people like Daniel and help them to learn new skills and to provide a stable income for their families.

There will be a second collection at all Masses on 5/6 October, please use an envelope in church, give online at <u>cafod.org.uk/envelope</u> CAFOD Parish Representative, Trish Bailey will give a brief talk about this year's Family Fast Day at the beginning of Mass next weekend.

Admittance to Hospital?

It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.



Annual Mass Count

8 29 September, 6th & 13th October. All parishes across all the dioceses of England and Wales will be undertaking the count, that is, the numbers of people in attendance in church at Sunday Mass. Until 2018, the count was taken over the four weeks of October, but experts argue that a better picture of the situation can be gained from taking instead the last two weekends of September and the first two weekends of October. As many parish priests point out, the school half-term holidays disrupt the usual statistics, with many families away, and others visiting. The numbers for 2024 for our Diocese will be interesting. In many of our parishes, numbers have not returned to what they were before the COVID pandemic. Yet there are also new faces around, with younger families especially. This suggests that the current situation is fluid. Numbers are not everything, of course, but the statistical data given this year will be useful to pastors and parishes in planning ahead and working out where resources need to be focused. Thank you in advance to all our priests, stewards and parishioners who will be facilitating this important endeayour.
