Mission in the Spirit of Sacrifice and Love

Today is World Mission Sunday. Today the Church invites us to reflect on our personal response and commitment to Christ's mission. It is a special day to revitalize our faith, and to rededicate ourselves to Christ's mission. It is also, a day to show special solidarity to all true missionaries who have responded to Christ mandate: "Go, make disciples of all nations."

Today, Pope Francis reminds us that: "Every man and woman is a mission. That is the reason for our life on this earth. Each one of us is called to reflect on this fact: 'I am a mission on this earth. That is the reason why I am here in this world' (Evangelii Gaudium, 273)." To young people Pope Francis adds: "You too, young friends, by your baptism you have become living members of the Church. Together, we have received the mission to bring the Gospel to everyone...To share in the mission to the ends of the earth demands the gift of oneself...I dare to say that, for a young man or woman who wants to follow Christ, what is most essential is to seek, to discover and to persevere in his or her vocation."

In today's gospel, through his dialogue with his disciples, Jesus opens our eyes to the realities that confront us in mission. By asking them: "Can you drink the cup that I must drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I must be baptized," Jesus reminds us of the challenges ahead of us in His mission.

Mission is service and sacrifice rendered in love for the salvation of all nations. This love comes with patience and docility to the will of God. It begins by transforming the missionary into a great instrument for the salvation of others. So, today Christ teaches us that to be great is to be ready to serve and to make sacrifice for others.

Hence, Isaiah reminds us that: "By his sufferings, my servant shall justify many, taking their faults on himself." So, through service and sacrifice, we shall find attain our own salvation. By liberating others, we shall liberate ourselves. By giving peace to others, we shall find our own peace. And, by identifying with others, Christ, shall identifies with us.

As we celebrate Mission Sunday today, the readings exhort us to be more faithful to God's mission both in us and in others. It reminds us of the great challenges before us today us in God's mission. This includes our changing cultures, societies and lifestyles that must be urgently evangelized and redeemed. The good news is that we can overcome these challenges through the spirit of sacrifice and love. So, amid all these challenges, we must find consolation in these words from the letter to the Hebrews: "Let us be confident, then in approaching the throne of grace, that we shall find mercy and grace when we are in need of help."

This grace is sufficient for us to accomplish God's mission. Therefore, with the psalmist, let us pray: "Lord, let your love be upon us, as we place our trust in you."

Prayers for life - stop assisted suicide

The Prime Minister is paving the way for a parliamentary vote before Christmas to legalise assisted suicide.

The Government and assisted suicide lobbyists are putting intense pressure on MPs to support a Private Members' Bill to rush legislation into law. A Private Members' Bill was the same mechanism used to legalise abortion in 1967.

This is contrary to Catholic teaching and, as we have seen in other countries like the Netherlands and Canada, it particularly puts vulnerable people at risk.

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list.

Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years.
