Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We continue to hear from a number of parishioners invited by Fr. Jeremy and Fr. James to share a little about their faith, what's important to them and what has helped them grow in their relationship with Jesus. This week we hear from parishioner, Teri Barnett ...

I am a 'cradle' Catholic, yes, another one! Born to practicing Catholic parents. I was brought up traditionally, Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, in house prayers morning and night, before and after meals and for special intentions, which were mostly to do with war which had started in 1939 when I was seven. I made my First Holy Communion and was Confirmed. My religion was a part of my life, I suppose I took it for granted.

I had a cousin, one of many, Jo was the only girl in her family and I was the only girl in mine so we became like sisters and I loved her very much. She was an Anglo-Catholic and we were surprised to find our religions were so similar. When she was in her forties, she said she wanted to convert, become a Roman Catholic. I was delighted and of course I helped her and stood at her side. Later I asked her if she felt any different and after a long pause, she said it felt like she had worn costume jewellery all her life and now someone had given her a priceless diamond tiara.

I was stunned to think I too had been given a priceless gift and had never really treated it as such. It had a huge affect on me, I thought about how much I had missed, I found I was in awe of the Mass, I was excited when it was time to pray, I couldn't wait for the time and opportunity to say the rosary. Above all, I was so much more eager to show my gift to others, I had always asked the Lord to bring my children to faith in Him, to bring them to church and to invite Him into their lives. Now I simply ask God to give each one of them His gift of faith.

I am in my nineties now and dearly wish that my waiting was over and I could, I hope, come face to face with my maker. But having now lost my independence and many of my faculties, I can only think the Lord is keeping me here to pray and to look for even the smallest opportunity to share my priceless gift with others. So, I am truly grateful that I have been a cradle Catholic since the moment of my conception.

*Jenny LeLean from Caritas Portsmouth draws our attention to Anti-Slavery week, runs from **14-20 October...***

We have invited Stevie Waight from the Medaille Trust to come to the next online Caritas networking lunch **Tuesday 15th October, 12:30-1pm** to explain more about Modern Slavery, how to spot the signs and what to do as well as the Move On Project she runs to support the victims. There are around 50 million people trapped in slavery around the world and 122,000 in the UK so this is something that is found in all our communities. Pope Francis urged us to walk in the footsteps of St Bakhita who was sold as a child into slavery and was a victim of traffickers until she landed in Italy, where she later became a Cannosian religious sister. "Saint Bakhita encourages us to open our eyes and ears to see those who go unseen and to hear those who have no voice, to acknowledge the dignity of each person, and to fight trafficking and all forms of exploitation."

As Kim Leadbeater came first in the Private Members' Bill ballot, it is now

All Readers - New Lectionary Translation Coming Soon!

All Catholic Churches in England and Wales are changing to the new translation of the Lectionary – the Book used for all Scripture Readings at Mass.

WHEN? The change will take place from the First Sunday of Advent (1st December 2024).

WHY? To make the text more faithful to the original language and easier to proclaim.

HOW? We are arranging sessions for **new and all existing** Readers to see it and try it out. For convenience, the sessions have been arranged spread over different weekday evenings and at weekends in the coming months to allow all Readers to attend. It is necessary for **all Readers at Sunday Mass** to attend before 1 December. Dates/Times available:

Wednesday 13 November 12:45-1.45pm at Sacred Heart

Wednesday 13 November 7-8pm at St Edmunds

Saturday 16 November 2-3pm at Sacred Heart

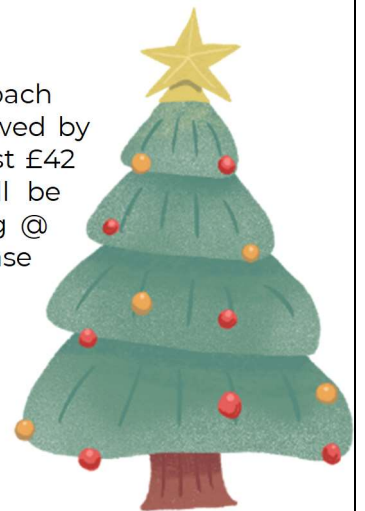

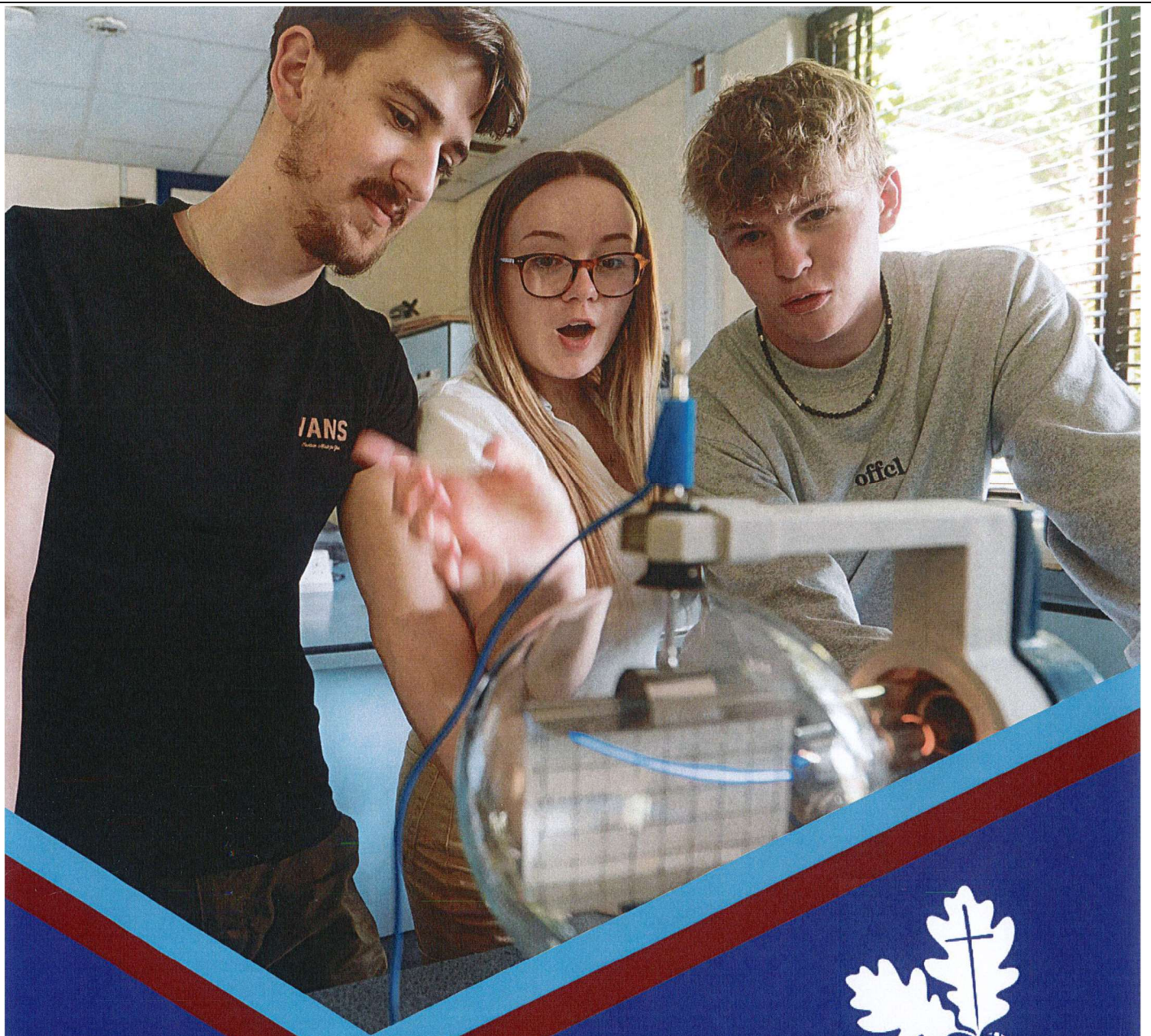

Modern Slavery

Signs to look for and how to report a concern

Appearance

- Show signs of physical or psychological abuse and untreated injuries
- Look underfed, unwashed, withdrawn and neglected
- Seem under the control or in fear of others
- Inappropriately dressed, either for the weather or for the job

Work

- Works long shifts
- Dropped off or picked up in crowded minibus
- Little or no safety equipment
- No payslip, and little or no pay
- Reluctant to talk, avoids eye contact

Asking for help

- Needs help now
- Fear of police, doesn't know who to trust
- Fear of employer
- Afraid of deportation, risk of violence to family or themselves
- Has no ID or control of ID documents

Accommodation

- Lives in dirty, cramped or overcrowded accommodation
- Lives and works at the same address
- Does not know address
- Appears unfamiliar with neighbourhood
