The Sanctity of Marriage and the Family of God

On this 27th Sunday of ordinary time, we are invited to reflect on the significance and importance of marriage and family as essential institutions founded by God the creator. In today's context, where unfortunately, these essential institutions are under serious threat, we are nevertheless challenge as Christ's disciples, to stay focused on the teachings of our Lord. So, it is important to note that whatever threatens marriage and family life threatens love, unity, and the entire human existence. Marriage plays a dual role. First, it serves the affection between couples and secondly, the sustenance of humanity through procreation.

Today, both our first reading and the gospel strongly call us to uphold the sanctity of marriage and family life. They both remind us that marriage is instituted by God. So, it must be cherished and protected. However, it is important to note that its challenges are overcomeable through God's grace and good Christian virtues. Marriage has its own joys, trials, and tribulations. Sadly, today's common experience is that divorce is the best way to resolve marital crisis. This might seem a right and fast solution. However, it is not always the case.

Today's readings remind us that it is not the will of God for any sacramental marriage to be broken: "This is why a man must leave his father and mother, and join himself to his wife, and they become one body. So, what God had united, man must not divide." Jesus tells us quite clearly that divorce is not part of God's plan. God's dream is that a man and woman who married are called to mirror the fidelity of God towards us. A married couple is asked to reflect the covenant love of God for his people, a God who never fails in this promise of fidelity to us. He will never abandon us. But Jesus knew that we do not live in an ideal world. We are not angelic people. It is very important to have ideals before us and to live by them. But being human we often, despite our most noble intentions, make mistakes and fail. Any couple married for a long time will say that it takes a lot of 'I do's' for a man and woman to become husband and wife, it takes a lot of dying to self. We all know from experience that there will be a lot of mistakes and compromises called for. But God's grace, his Spirit is always there to empower us. Who doesn't make mistakes from time to time? This is equally true of priesthood and religious life. It is our daily reality.

Today and always, the Church must proclaim the ideal of fidelity in marriage. This is God's design for us. But the Church also recognizes that it can happen, and does, that the two partners in marriage may be unable to sustain their relationship so that their marriage no longer functions. It has become impossible to live in peace with each other without destroying each other. Here again the Church must echo the gospel. And THIS IS THE GOOD NEWS OF TODAY'S GOSPEL. It must proclaim the message of God's mercy, of his liberating forgiveness. The gospel gives every person a future. There is no human failure so great that it is completely hopeless and no longer open to God's mercy. God is the God of the second chance and the third and so on.

Let us sympathize and pray for all those going through difficult times in their marriages. We pray that God will give them the grace, strength, and wisdom to find peace in their homes. We also pray that those intending to be united in this Holy Sacrament, through the grace of God, that they may not be discouraged but may find fulfillment in love.

Safeguarding E-Learning

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has developed the Learning Management System (LMS) as an online learning platform specifically for the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

Training is now aligned with the nature of the role the volunteer is undertaking and 3 modules are available:

Level 1 – Casual volunteers (roles with no DBS eligibility).

Level 2 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility but do not require a check of the barred list. Level 3 – Volunteers who hold a role with DBS eligibility, including a check of the barred list.

Level 3 is mandatory for anyone who holds a role within the parish working with either

- children
- adults at risk or those who might otherwise be vulnerable.

Training must be refreshed every 2 years. If your training is not up to date, please register for either face-to-face or on-line training at: https://www.portsmouthdiocese.org.uk/about-

Attendees will receive certificates on completion of their training to support continuing ministry.

Prayers for life - stop assisted suicide

The Prime Minister is paving the way for a parliamentary vote before Christmas to legalise assisted suicide. The Government and assisted suicide lobbyists are putting intense pressure on MPs to support a Private Members' Bill to rush legislation into law. A Private Members' Bill was the same mechanism used to legalise abortion in 1967. This is contrary to Catholic teaching and, as we have seen in other countries like the Netherlands and Canada, it particularly puts vulnerable people at risk.
