32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) — Remembrance Sunday

10th November 2024

Wisdom is readily seen and found by those who look for her

This weekend, in union with millions of others, we celebrate Remembrance Sunday (also called Poppy Day) in the UK. Remembrance Sunday is held in the United Kingdom as a day "to commemorate the contribution of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women in the two World Wars and later conflicts. The celebrations today mark the 106th anniversary of the signing of the First World War armistice that brought an end of hostilities in the First World War in 1918 as a new era of peace was made after four long devastating years of war. More than 34 million British men and women were killed and countless others were maimed, wounded or emotionally destroyed. Today, Remembrance Sunday, it is an opportunity for us to remember and honour those who lost their lives in these Great Wars and in subsequent conflicts since around the world; to hold silence together; and to allow our remembrances to help us, if we can face a little more honestly the truth of what it means to be human, and deepen our commitment to making peace in our own day.

Silence, remembering, and peace-making. In all of this, we seek the thread of God's love. When we look at the dreadful cost of war and the sacrifices made by so many, we wonder if we can truly believe. With the incomprehensible loss of life of War, communities back home were in some ways silenced too. Not just by the silence of peace but by the silence of loss: The silence of the Lost Generation, who never returned home to talk and joke, and live and breathe. They were silenced by the grief of so many lost in communities, often because their loved ones had signed up with their friends together: Kitchener's from the same factory, or sports team, or village. Sadly, history remains a poor teacher in the face of current wars. No one in their right senses will defy the odds to admit that war is a good thing or a solution to a problem.

Such is the case in the Middle East, in Russia's war on Ukraine, in Sudan, Haiti, the Boko Haram in African and the French's war on English Cameroon. War! War! War! Where have you come from and when are you to leave?

Some years ago, there was a television advertisement that tried to sell a certain sort of insurance by saying that security was the most basic human instinct. To illustrate this the advert featured the Great Wall of China as a fortress against foreign invasion. A wall or a fence, is of course primarily built for security, but the question is why a wall or fence? Often, such walls or fences are not built to keep out wild animals or evil spirits. They are built as protection from other people, from each other, marking out territory and thus to keep others out. Also consider the great Berlin Wall, The American Wall with Mexico, etc. Although this temporarily solves or averts a problem, the question remains whether it is the most basic? Isn't it rather a sign of our failure to love each other, and not just our need to be secure.

As we remember all those who died because of the failures that ended in war and as we consider the growing divisions and binary arguments, fake news and hate speech that separate us from each other in our world today, how can we establish peace? And where should our allegiances lie? To those whose side of the wall we happen to share? To those on the other side of the Wall? Or to those who care for peace so much that they are prepared to tear walls down?

On such a day, we align ourselves with the vision of Christ – working for peace breaking down walls and fences that divide us from one another. Working for this vision and letting our communion with God inspire and equip us, is the best way of honouring those who died to secure our peace and whose sacrifice we remember today, and the best way of building a different sort of world.
