November: Month of the Holy Souls

New Lectionary Translation

The change will take place from the First Sunday of Advent (1st December 2024).

WHY? To make the text more faithful to the original language and easier to proclaim.

It is necessary for **all Readers at Sunday Mass** to attend before 1 December, if you haven't yet attended a session, there is still a chance to come along on **Saturday 16 November 2-3pm at Sacred Heart.**

Last push to defeat Assisted Suicide Bill

A bill has been introduced to Parliament by Kim Leadbeater MP to legalise assisted suicide. This will be voted on by MPs on 29th November. We know that assisted suicide laws in other jurisdictions have had devastating consequences for the poor, disabled and marginalised. This is the biggest threat to the vulnerable in a decade, and we need a huge effort to lobby MPs to vote against the bill. Please urgently contact your MP and ask him/her to vote against the bill. Stand Against Domestic Abuse

Catholic parishes are among the best placed to identify and support individuals who may be victims of domestic abuse. Parish priests, deacons, secretaries and safeguarding teams are at the frontlines of community and as such it is important that they are all equipped to spot the signs, know what support is available and to effectively signpost individuals. We encourage you to attend our webinar on 18th November to learn more and respond to the Pope's call to action, to help those stuck in an abusive and dangerous situation to escape and seek the support they need.

This summer, the National Police Chiefs' Council published their findings, estimating that 2 million women are victims of violence perpetrated by men each year across the UK. Yvette Cooper, the Home Secretary has described the levels of violence against women and girls as a national emergency.

Caritas Social Action Network (CSAN), an agency of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England & Wales, together with Safe in Faith, hosts the Domestic Abuse Alliance, and we invite you to join us online on November 18th @ 11am to discuss this national emergency and launch our call-to-action across the Catholic community in response to the Pope's call to 'act immediately, at all levels'.

Admittance to Hospital?

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.


